SATURDAY'S GAME: The Washington State University football team begins its 116th season when it faces Idaho State University at Martin Stadium, Saturday, Sept. 3. Gametime is set for 2 p.m. and can be heard across the IMG College Sports Radio Network and will be webcast on wsucougars.com. The Cougars serve as the hosts for the inaugural meeting between the two programs as former WSU assistant Mike Kramer begins his first season as the Bengals head coach.

WASHINGTON STATE vs. IDAHO STATE - THE SERIES: Today's meeting is the first in series history.

COUGARS IN OPENERS: Washington State University boast a 68-42-5 record in season openers in their 115-year history. WSU is 76-34-3 all-time in home openers, including games in Pullman, Spokane and Seattle. Since 1990 the Cougars boast a 14-7 record in home debuts, and are 24-12 dating back to the start of the 1975 season.

WSU VS. THE BIG SKY: Dating back to a 34-0 victory over Montana in 1903, the Cougars have played 44 games against teams currently in the Big Sky Conference. WSU is 42-2 in those games – including 19 shutouts – and has not lost to a team currently in the Big Sky in more than 60 years. The Cougars have won 14-straight meetings to Big Sky schools since a 13-12 road loss to Montana in 1947. The only other loss was also to the Grizzlies, a 10-0 setback, also in Missoula. The Cougars are 26-0 when playing a current Big Sky school in Pullman. The last meeting came in 2010 when WSU defeated Montana State, 23-22.

WSU VS. FCS: Since the formation of the Pacific-10 Conference in 1978, the Cougars have won all 15 games played against Football Championship Subdivision (formerly Division I-AA) schools. Six of the victories have come against Montana State and 11 of the wins have come against teams currently in the Big Sky.

COUGARS IN FIRST-TIME MEETINGS: Since the start of the 2001 season, Washington State University has played nine series-beginning games and recorded a 7-2 record in those contests. The most recent game came in 2009 when WSU needed overtime to defeat SMU in Pullman.

The Washington State University football team was represented by four student-athletes on the Phil Steele Preseason All-Pac-12 Conference Teams. Sophomore receiver Marquess Wilson, senior offensive guard B.J. Guerra and junior defensive end Travis Long garnered second-team honors. Sophomore offensive tackle John Fullington was a third-team selection while senior linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis and sophomore safety Deone Bucannon were named to the fourth-team. Long and Wilson were also named to the second team for both Lindy's and Athlon's magazines.

WASHINGTON STATE EXPANDS RADIO COVERAGE IN THE SEATTLE AREA:

Washington State University Athletics and IMG College have agreed to a multi-year, multi-faceted agreement with Bonneville Seattle Media Group giving WSU exclusive coverage of Cougar football in the Seattle area. The three-year agreement, which begins with this week's contest against Idaho State, includes coverage of all WSU football games on 770 KTTH AM, a weekly segment on 710 ESPN Seattle during the Kevin Calabro Show with Jim Moore from 3-7 p.m. weekdays, a dedicated section on MyNorthwest.com and 710Sports.com, full-time streaming of football games, along with podcasts of games and related Cougar Athletics programming on both KTTH and 710 ESPN Seattle. Additionally, Cougar gamedays include a two-hour pregame and one hour postgame football show, along with a 30-minute pre and postgame show for men's basketball. Bonneville Seattle Media Group is the home of NewsTalk 97.3 KIRO FM, 710 ESPN Seattle, 770 KTTH AM. It is home to the Seattle Seahawks, Seattle Mariners, Sounders FC, Seattle University men's basketball, the Seattle Thunderbirds and now Washington State University football and men's basketball.

WALDEN TO MISS OPENER: Washington State University Hall of Fame coach and current Cougar radio broadcaster Jim Walden will miss this week's contest against Idaho State as he is being inducted into the University of Wyoming Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame in Laramie, Wyo. In his two years at Wyoming, Walden quarterbacked the Cowboys to a 17-4 record while earning All-America Honorable Mention and Skyline Conference Player of the Year honors as a senior.

KARSTETTER NAMED CANDIDATE FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: WSU senior wide receiver Jared Karstetter was recently selected as one of the 30 candidates for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I FBS senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence — community, classroom, character and completion. Karstetter is a two-time All-Pac-10 Conference honorable mention selection, a two-time Academic All-Pac-10 selection and a 2010 ESPN CoSIDA Academic All-District VII First Team honoree. The Spokane native is set to graduate this spring with a bachelor's degree in zoology and currently holds a 3.61 cumulative GPA.

WILSON NAMED TO BILETNIKOFF WATCH LIST: Sophomore wide receiver Marquess Wilson was named to the 2011 Fred Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List, the College Football Awards Association announced prior to the season. Last season, Wilson was placed on numerous Freshman All-America teams after catching 55 passes for 1,006 yards and six touchdowns. Brandon Gibson was the last Cougar to receive the accolade, appearing on the 2008 watch list. The Fred Biletnikoff Award is presented to the nation's most outstanding receiver by The Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation. The award is named after Fred Biletnikoff, a former All-American at Florida State and member of the College and Pro Football halls of fame. The winner will be announced Dec. 8 at The Home Depot College Football Awards Show.

Head Coach Paul Wulff



Paul Wulff enters his fourth season on the Cougar sideline after being named Washington's State's 31st head coach, Dec. 10, 2007. With his appointment Wulff became the first WSU football letterwinner and graduate to lead the Cougars since Phil Sarboe served as head coach from 1945-49.

With three full recruiting classes under his belt heading into the 2011 campaign, Wulff has the Cougars on the rise following three years of rebuilding a program from the ground up. The end of 2010 saw a glimpse of what is coming as WSU earned its first Pacific-10 Conference road win under Wulff, a 31-14 victory at Oregon State. The following week WSU dropped a heartbreaker in the Apple Cup, falling to Washington 35-28. The back-to-back games with 28-plus points showed the offense has come miles from even the 2009 season.

A 1990 graduate of WSU and a four-year letterwinner, Wulff's first season leading the Cougars proved difficult as the transition to a new head coach combined with numerous injuries resulted in a 2-11 record. WSU's lone conference win came in dramatic fashion as the Cougars needed a last-second field goal in regulation, and again in double overtime, to defeat Washington 16-13 in the Apple Cup.

Wulff's second season was once again marred by injuries, yet progress was being made as 13 freshmen and 23 players overall made their first-collegiate starts. The bright spot of the year came in week three as WSU fought back from a 13-point fourth-quarter deficit to defeat SMU in overtime, 30-27.

Prior to Washington State, Wulff spent the previous 15 seasons at Eastern Washington University, the final eight as head coach. There he amassed a record of 53-40 while his current 11-year head coaching record stands at 58-72. During his eight-year head coaching tenure Wulff was named Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year three times (2001, 2004, 2005) and led the Eagles into the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs three times in his final four seasons.

In 2007 he guided the Eagles to a 9-4 mark, including a quarterfinal appearance at the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs, falling to two-time defending champion Appalachian State. It marked the seventh time in his eight years at Eastern that his teams posted winning records.

Wulff began his coaching career at EWU in 1993 as a volunteer assistant working with the offensive line. He was named offensive line/strength coach the following season and spent four years in the position before being promoted to offensive coordinator/offensive line/strength coach in 1998. Following two seasons as the team's offensive coordinator, Wulff was named head coach prior to the 2000 season. He guided the Eagles to six-straight winning seasons and seven overall during his eight-year tenure.

Wulff's 2005 team was loaded with experience, talent and leadership, featuring a group of seniors that included the Big Sky's Offensive and Defensive MVP's (Erik Meyer and Joey Cwik), and featured a trio of All-Americans (Meyer, Eric Kimble and Matt Alfred). Meyer would go on to win the Walter Payton Award as the best football player in the Football Championship Subdivision. The Eagles finished 7-5 and won the Big Sky title with a 5-2 record before losing to eventual national runner-up Northern Iowa in the first round of the playoffs.

In 2004, Wulff's squad finished 9-4 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the playoffs. The crowning glory came when the Eagles knocked off No. 1-ranked and top-seeded Southern Illinois in the first round.

Statistically, the 2004 and 2005 teams were nearly identical with each finishing the year ranked fourth in FCS in total offense. In 2005 the Eagles averaged 477.8 yards per game, and were 14th in scoring (35.0). A year earlier the Eagles averaged 475.5 yards and 37.5 points per game to rank sixth.

Wulff coached 21 players to 54 Football Championship Subdivision (formerly Division I-AA) All-America honors in his first seven years at the helm of the EWU program, and two more of his players were named to the Sports Network's 2007 FCS All-America team at the conclusion of last year. Of the 21 players to earn All-America recognition, 15 have been offensive lineman. Additionally, Wulff mentored 15 players who have earned 18 total CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII honors and a total of 131 All-Big Sky Conference Academic team members.

As a student-athlete and four-year starter at center for the Cougars from 1986-89, Wulff was an All-America honoree himself as a senior, earning honorable mention accolades from The Sporting News. Wulff started at center under three different coaches after redshirting in 1985. He played for Jim Walden in 1986, Dennis Erickson from 1987-88 and Mike Price in 1989. He was also the starting center on WSU's 1988 Aloha Bowl championship team.

After a successful collegiate career Wulff had a brief pro career as a center after graduating from WSU in 1990. He signed a free agent contract with the New York Jets, but was released after injuring an ankle and a rib in the preseason. He played in spring 1991 with Raleigh-Durham of the World League, then played in spring 1992 with New York-New Jersey.

A 1985 graduate of Davis High School in Davis, Calif., Wulff played for three different coaches while he was at WSU. He redshirted in 1985 and started four games at guard in 1986 under Jim Walden.

Dennis Erickson directed the program in 1987 and 1988 with Wulff as his starting center both years. In 1988, the Cougars were victorious in the Aloha Bowl as Wulff earned honorable mention All-Pacific-10 Conference honors.

Under Mike Price in 1989, Wulff earned second-team all-conference honors and was an honorable mention selection on The Sporting News All-America squad. He was also WSU's long snapper during his stay there.

Wulff was born Feb. 25, 1967, in Woodland, Calif. He and his wife Sherry have a daughter, Katie, and two sons, Max and Sam.
